PROJECT OVERVIEW

In 2020, Hays County residents voted for the Parks & Open Space Bond (Proposition A) which provided \$75 million to fund parks open spaces, conservation lands, and other recreational opportunities over the next several years.

As a part of that Parks & Open Spaces bond package, Hays County is working with the San Marcos community to develop a Conceptual Park Plan and implementation strategy for Cape's Pond Park. This Conceptual Park Plan will serve as a guide for further design development, with specific design elements coming at a later phase in the project development.



Goals of the Project:



Assess community preferences and identify characteristics and factors that will shape the park



To create a defined action plan for moving forward with the development of the park




Build a consensus and commitment between the community and County



EXISTING CONDITIONS

Cape's Pond Park is a 28.7-acre parcel of undeveloped parkland located at Cape Road and Luciano Flores Blvd, that features a 5.8-acre spring-fed pond.



The Texas Parks and Wildlife
Fish Hatchery is south of the
site, and Stokes Park is on the
east side of the site, separated
from Cape's Pond Park by the
San Marcos River.

Vegetation consists primarily of grasses, with small trees around the perimeter of the pond, along the swale through the park and along the south and eastern property lines.




TEXAS PARKS AND WILDLIFE COMMUNITY FISHING LAKE

In 2020, Hays County Commissioners Debbie Ingalsbe and Mark Jones collaborated with Texas Parks and Wildlife (TPWD) to designate Cape's Pond as a future TPWD Community Fishing Lake.

Key Features of Community Fishing Lakes

- Regular Stocking
 - Community Fishing Lakes are regularly stocked by TPWD with channel catfish, rainbow trout, or other species
- Easy to Follow Regulations
 - Daily bag limit of 5 fish total (all species combined), of which only 1 may be a black bass
 - No minimum length limits, except black bass which must be 14 inches or greater in length
- Youth-Friendly
 - Kids 16 & under can fish without a license
 - Anyone 17 years or older must have a fishing license, unless exempt







PREVIOUS FEEDBACK GATHERED

Throughout the project development, including the first Open House and stakeholder meetings, the project team has identified the below key takeaways from input gathered:

- Preserve the existing nature of the park
- Consider connectivity to nearby trails, parks, and attractions
- Honor local and Indigenous culture and history related to the park and surrounding historic areas
- Provide adequate parking
- Desire for on-site restrooms
- Implement bank stabilization along the San Marcos River
- Consider the relationship between any proposed improvements and flood zones
- Ensure adequate tree coverage or shade options
- Ensure adequate separation from vehicles and unsafe driving conditions along Cape Road
